




WHO ARE CHANGE AGENTS?

We make transition! (2023-2025) is a transnational project financed by the Interreg Baltic Sea Region Programme. It involves 11 partners from 6 countries. The project key aim is to find new ways for interaction and cooperation between local authorities and various civil society actors working for sustainability in topics such as circular and sharing economy, sustainable food, biodiversity and social sustainability.

Project partners have selected and invited change agents from Finland, Estonia, Latvia, Poland, Germany and Norway. Their aim is to co-create a joint sustainability vision for the Baltic Sea region and recommendations related to strengthening the role of civil society actors and their cooperation with local authorities. Change agents are individuals representing orgnizations from different levels. They are committed to making a difference in their communities or organizations. They are the ones who challenge the status quo and strive to bring about positive change.

Change agents are not afraid to take risks and are willing to work to achieve their goals. Whether they are working on environmental sustainability, social justice, or economic development, change agents are making a difference in the world and inspiring others to follow their example.


Anda Briede, Latvia

Jaanus Tamm, Estonia




Krista Willman, Finland

Muecella Demir, Germany



Leona Silberstein, Finland






Robert Ropel & Sebastian Kulis, Poland

Laura Forsman, Finland



Johan Santalahti, Finland




Tomasz Kośmider, Poland






Jaana Eriksson, Finland


Sven Tobreluts, Estonia

Patrycja Léonard-Pawluk, Poland




Agata Lewandowska, Poland

Anna Evilä, Finland




Kairi Niinepuu-Mark, Estonia
